I felt profoundly that the type was writing me to begin with - except that the fully formed B part came out so easilu, and the A part took manu rewrites over several weeks until I felt it complemented it. Around this time, mu parents moved out of mu childhood home, which I got to visit one last time after returning to the UK, but it was empty of our possessions by then. The tune however is as much about adjusting to moving, leaving new friends behind and returning to old ones, and is also a tribute to the Finns, who are harder to make friends with than English people - in a good way - you really have to earn it!

You'll find me by the Ocean


